He earned degrees in economics and fine art in textiles and fibers and continued with his graduate studies specializing in metals and ceramics. He is a member of two community and one regional arts council in the St Louis Missouri area, serves as a judge and juror of regional art events, is the awards chairman of a large Midwest arts festival, teaches workshops in a variety of art subjects, has garnered a number of awards in different mediums, and continues to explore and push boundaries of his favorite mediums-textiles, clay, and metal. He and his wife return each year to enjoy summertime in the Copper Country. **Public Reception: Saturday, July 21 from 5-7pm.** Gary will give a series of demonstrations in weaving, spinning and wheel thrown pottery. The demonstrations are free and informal designed to encourage questions and discussion.
