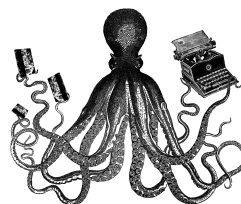

Kerredge Gallery: Listening to Parks

Listening to Parks is a sound installation with panoramic vistas of shorelines, waves, and wind contrasted with detailed examination of lichen, the rustling of small creatures, and the many calls of birds. The installation's form follows its goals surrounding the listener in sound and images supported by a physical structure of beautifully curved shapes highlighting the natural maple of the region.

Listening to Parks is a multimedia experience on display in the Kerredge Gallery June 9 through July 7. The exhibition explores our relationships to Lake Superior through Isle Royale National Park, Grand Portage National Monument, Apostle Islands National Lakeshore, Keweenaw National Historic Park and Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore.

The exhibition of sound and imagery was created by Christopher Plummer, Libby Meyer, and Kent Cyr all faculty members at Michigan Tech University and was made possible with funding from the National Endowment for the Arts, the National Parks Service, and the National Parks of Lake Superior Foundation.

**VSA Michigan Emerging Artists' Touring Exhibit
Yo Soy... Je Suis... I Am... Motivated to Create**

VSA Michigan's Emerging Artist Touring Exhibit celebrates the creativity of children, youth and adults with disabilities as expressed through visual arts, and to gain awareness for VSA Michigan and the opportunities that the organization offers to artists with disabilities.

Each spring VSA Michigan publishes a Call for Art, which appears on the VSA Michigan website at www.vsami.org, and distributes copies of the Call to VSA Michigan affiliate committees, art teachers, special educators and individual artists with disabilities.

Each year over 150 works of art are received and 30-40 works are chosen for the exhibit, equally divided between works created by elementary-aged children, secondary-aged youth and adults. This year's theme is "Yo Soy... Je Suis... I Am... Motivated to Create 2018-2019" and there are 38 pieces in the exhibition. Two will be selected to be entered into the VSA/Kennedy Center Call for Art for a national exhibition.

Artist Market Featured Artist

William Thompson was born and raised in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. He is an honorably discharged disabled Marine veteran. In the spring of 2018 William graduated from Finlandia University this time earning a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree with a concentration in ceramics. His art is inspired by the history and traditions of human craft, creative problem solving, and the result of indulging his inner child's undying desire to carve, doodle, and create.
