CCCAC Kerredge Gallery: January 28-February 28, 2023

The Kalevala is a 19th century work of poetry compiled by Elias Lönnrot from Finnish and Karelian oral folklore and mythology. It is regarded as the national epic poem of Finland and is one of the significant works of Finnish literature. Our annual open call exhibition asks artists to create artwork relating to the many animals that are part of the Finnish epic poem, as imagery and symbolism. Bernembering Kathy Lekvin f

Kathy Lekvin was a wonderful person and CCCAC volunteer clay co-op manager for many years. She and Tammy Gajewski were responsible for starting and managing the CCCAC Clay Co-op. Kathy recently passed away and we asked her friend and fellow co-op manager Tammy Gajewski to share some words.

"Kathy and I met in the year 2000 at Maryann Predebon's raku class held at CCCAC followed by a potluck at Maryann's house. We bonded immediately as friends. Kathy was always upbeat, kind, and positive. When Maryann retired, Kathy and I decided to open a clay cooperative to use the space and provide a low cost outlet for creativity. She would say it was all my idea but I could not have done it without her help. We called ourselves "the hot flash club" for a few years until some guys joined the cooperative.



Kathy always had a warm smile, a gift, or a funny story to share about her dogs, her sons, or her husband. I have only seen her angry once and it wasn't over her diagnosis. She had lived in Korea and after moving here, made little pigs with hats and outfits out of clay to give away for good luck. When the studio needed a new floor Kathy donated a large portion of the money to make that happen. When she was diagnosed with cancer she somehow became more positive and caring.

I never had heard of someone being on maintenance for pancreatic cancer but she had shrunk all the tumors, went to Florida, and made all her Christmas presents this past fall. Kathy had the strength, will power, and the belief she could beat it and was successful for far longer than the doctors expected. Kathy would have said that the New Year was a new beginning for us to keep creating without her while she had some wine with her dogs and Pam Sheridan up in heaven. Kathy had the greatest laugh, especially if you caught her off guard. Kathy did not want a funeral and wanted any remembrances to be sent to the art center because that is how important it was to her life. We will all miss her greatly."
