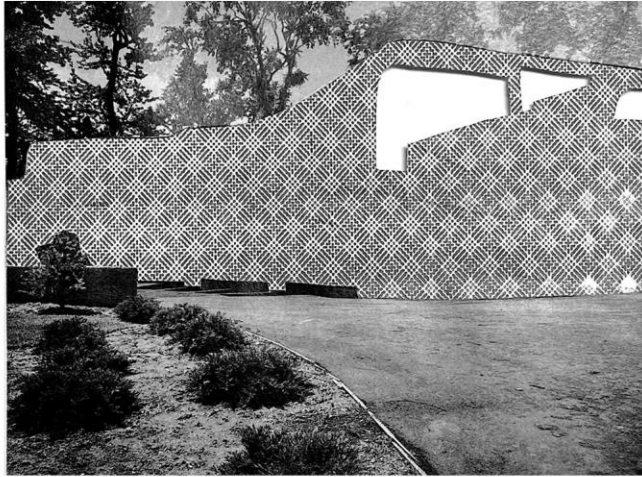

Inside Out, collages and drawings by Emily Lanctot

CCCAC Kerredge Gallery July 1-31, 2021



Inside Out includes two bodies of work by Emily Lanctot. *Secure Spaces* are collages made from cut apart and reassembled print media scenes with additional shapes cut from blue and white security envelopes to suggest dwellings. Her statement reads, "For some folks, having a house, an education, or a car means having security. For others, having these exact things may be a reminder of how close they are to losing them."

Ingredients is a series of drawings inspired by old recipe cards and cookbooks. Emily states, "The accompanying images of food

demonstrate domestic marvels and mirror the similarly delicious photographs that we see on Instagram today. They amplify and shine up simple ingredients to create a kind of desire. The images I'm referencing are of a particular vintage and therefore can conjure feelings of nostalgia. The drawings aim to show that recipes can be a conduit that reminds us of special meals shared. They are evidence that we can choose to see or see through the magic." The two bodies of work together invite the viewer to lose themselves in an intimate world of delicious treats and dreamy landscapes.

Emily Lanctot lives and works in Marquette. She is the Director and Curator of Northern Michigan University's DeVos Art Museum and a Contingent Assistant Professor at NMU's School of Art and Design. She teaches classes that focus on art theory and methodology, as well as the social impact of Art & Design. Lanctot received a BFA in Drawing and Painting from Northern Michigan University and an MFA in Interdisciplinary Studio Arts from Vermont College of Fine Arts. Her work is also currently on display at Eagle Harbor General Store Museum.

MCACA Minigrants Round 1 The CCCAC facilitates funding opportunities for the arts in the six counties of the Western Upper Peninsula; Baraga, Gogebic, Houghton, Iron, Keweenaw, and Ontonagon. Minigrants for Arts Projects provide up to \$4,000 for locally developed, high quality arts projects, which provide special opportunities to address local arts needs and increase public access to the arts. Nonprofit organizations, libraries, municipalities, and K-12 schools from the six counties may apply. Professional and Organizational Development grants make funding available for training courses, consultants, conference fees and related travel. Organizations or individual artists and arts educators may apply for up to \$1500.

The deadline is 5:00pm August 3, 2021 for projects taking place October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022. 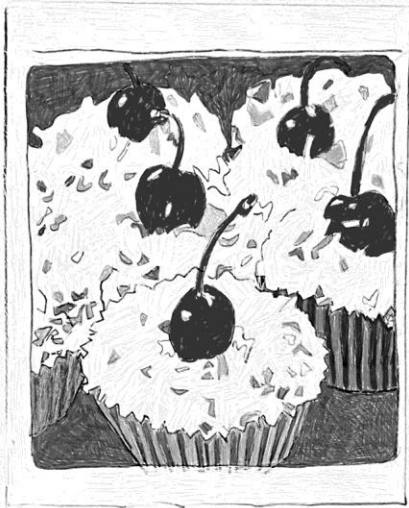
